 ORDINANCE NO. 20

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND FIXING OR PRESCRIBING RATES OF MARKET FEES AND RENTALS OF MARKET STALLS TO BE COLLECTED FROM LESSEES OR OCCUPANTS OF MARKET STALLS ABRIDING THE SPECIFIC PORTIONS, DESIGNATED AS SCHEDULES E-12, E-9 AND E-62 OF ORDINANCE NO. 1, SERIES OF 1947 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING RULES AND REGULATIONS AND FIXING LICENSE FEES AND OTHER REVENUES; REVISES, AMENDS AND SUPERSEDES ALL PREVIOUS ORDINANCES ON IMPOSITION AND COLLECTION OF MUNICIPAL AND OTHER REVENUES; ALSO RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SAME"; AND ORDINANCE NO. 22, SERIES OF 1958, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION NINE OF ORDINANCE NO. 8, SERIES OF 1955, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 16, SERIES OF 1955; ENTITLED 'PRESCRIBING RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING DISPOSITION AND LEASE OF MARKET STALLS IN THE MARKET TIENDAS".

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of Mandaue City, that:

SECTION 1, - Definition of terms,-

(a) Public Market is a public place where things necessary for subsistence or for convenience of life are sold and to which all persons can repair who wish to buy and sell articles there exposed for sale, It is a place, building or structure of any kind designated as such by the City Council.

(b) Market Stall refers to any allotted space or booth in the public market where merchandise or any kind is sold or offered for sale.

The use of these spaces or stalls and rentals thereof shall be made on two conditions:

(1) Permanent - It shall refer to the class of stalls where monthly rentals shall be payable in advance (not later

For every vendor selling salted fish, for each kind for every 10 kilos .....	0.05
For every vendor selling small fresh fish for every every 10 kilos or fraction thereof .....	0.10
For every vendor selling salted fish, for each kind for every 10 kilos .....	0.05
For every vendors selling small smoked fish for every 10 kilos or fraction thereof .....	0.10
For every vendor selling salted shells such as muskong etc. for every 5 kilos or fraction thereof .....	0.05

For every vendor selling all kinds of vegetables .....	0.15
For every vendor selling chickens per dozen .....	0.50
For every vendor selling chickens at retail for every 5 fowls .....	0.20
For every vendor selling eggs below 50 pieces at retail .....	0.05
For every vendor selling pots, jars, etc. ....	0.20
For every vendor selling pots only .....	0.05
For every vendor selling rice or corn grits per sack .....	0.20
For every vendor selling palay or dawa at retail for every 5 gantas .....	0.05
For every vendor selling fibers such as abaca, piña, naguay, etc. for every 10 kilos or fraction thereof ..	0.10
For every merchant of sari-sari goods per square meters ..	0.20
For every vendor selling foods or in a form of cendereria for every 2 square meters or fraction thereof .....	0.20
For every vendor selling bread, dulce or candy, etc. ... for every 2 square meters .....	0.20
For every vendor selling potatoes, mats, hats made of buri and awali, baskets, etc. per square meters ....	0.20
For every vendor selling only one kind of article mentioned in the preceding paragraph, per sq.m. ....	0.10
For every vendor selling sugar (including Mascovado) at retail for every 10 kilos or fraction thereof .....	0.20
For every vendor selling paints of different kinds for every 10 kilon or 22 lbs. or fraction thereof ...	0.20
For every vendor selling mascovado only for every 10 kilos or fraction thereof .....	0.10
For every vendor selling buyo, buaga, etc. ....	0.05
For other articles or commodities not specified or indicated above, for every 10 kilos or fraction thereof .....	0.15

MEAT MARKET FEES :

There shall be collected from every dealer or vendor of dressed meat based on the following rates to be paid immediately after weighing of the same for which official receipt shall be issued:

- (a) For every dressed carabeo meat per kilo ..... 0.04
- (b) For every dressed cow meat per kilo ..... 0.04

(c) For every dressed horse meat per kilo .....	P	0.04
(d) For every dressed pig meat per kilo .....		0.04
(e) For every dressed sheep or goat per head .....		0.75
(f) For every dressed pig (lactan), per head .....		0.75

MEAT INSPECTION FEES PER HEAD :

Cow .....	P	0.30
Carabao .....		0.50
Horse .....		0.30
Pig .....		0.25
Sheep or goat .....		0.20

SECTION 4. - The notification of articles or commodities to be displayed or offered for sale within the market premises shall be determined by the Market Committee in consultation with the Market Superintendent or Market Inspector to be approved by the City Treasurer.

SECTION 5. - Any person or persons violating any of the provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not exceeding P10.00 or subsidiary imprisonment in case of insolvency at the rate of P5.00 per day.

SECTION 6. - This ordinance shall take effect on January 1st, 1971.


